About our speakers

Joe Horton is a nationally recognized thought leader on the topic of transformational leadership in healthcare. Joe began his healthcare administrative career by serving as Chief Operating Officer of Intermountain Health's Cottonwood Hospital in Murray. He later transferred to Primary Children's Hospital as Chief Operating Officer and became Chief Executive Officer at PCH in 1994.

In 2001, Joe fulfilled a two-year term as Chairman of the National Association of Children's Hospitals and Related Institutions (NACHRI). Six years later he was appointed Senior Vice President of Intermountain Healthcare and assumed responsibility for all of Intermountain's 23 hospitals until his retirement in 2012. Since Fall 2010, Joe has been a Visiting Professor at the University of Michigan, where he teaches leadership to graduate students. He joined the David Eccles School of Business at the University of Utah as an Adjunct Professor in 2012. Joe's teaching focuses on healthcare leadership and ethics, which he believes



has a direct impact on the present and future culture of healthcare, employee behavior, and the patient experience. By drawing on his extensive management background, Joe has a deep understanding of the critical thinking and emotional intelligence that leaders need to develop in order to apply strategic management principles. Mr. Horton's experience dealing with team development and management, mission, vision and values, disciplinary issues, and day-to-day operations places an emphasis on executing the healthcare mission at the highest level.

Matt Emerzian has been on a mission to create a world where everyone embraces how much and why they matter. He is the bestselling author of four books and a highly sought-after keynote speaker, having taken the stage for Zoom, Google, Outreach, HP, Jack in the Box, Genentech, Amgen and more. Matt is also the founder and CEO of Every Monday Matters (EMM), a non-profit organization impacting millions of lives. The EMM K-12 Education Program serves over three million students nationwide. The EMM Employee Engagement and Culture Program is changing the cultures of companies of all sizes, and the EMM Senior Living Program is bringing dignity and purpose to our senior population who deserve to know how much and why they matter. After achieving great success in the music industry and the SVP of Robert



Kardashian's music marketing company and working on projects for the biggest artists in the world, Matt woke up on a Monday morning with a massive panic attack that turned into chronic anxiety and depression. Realizing everything he thought mattered actually didn't, he set out on a journey to rediscover his life's purpose and why he matters. Matt realized that mattering is at the heart of everything and developed The Mattering MindsetTM, a methodology that has transformed countless lives, organizations and communities.

Mallory Bateman is the Director of Demographic Research and State Data Center Coordinator at the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute. Mallory has authored research on a range of topics including community research on Salt Lake City and Salt Lake County, generations, fertility, transportation, and commuting.
